Hamburger Smash

How to Write a Paragraph

Introduction

- Show children a gummy hamburger candy, a real hamburger, or a picture of a hamburger
- Ask children, what items are typically in a hamburger? Focus on the facts that there are two buns with different items inside
- Why is a bun important? Explain that while a hamburger has lots of yummy things inside that add flavor and interest, a bun is important because **it holds the hamburger together**. Without the bun, your hamburger falls apart.
- When we write and share about a topic or idea, often it is very similar to a hamburger. We often need a bun on top and bottom to hold our ideas together. This is called a **paragraph**.

(Show picture of hamburger)

- Show hamburger handout as you discuss the parts of paragraph.
- Explain a paragraph is a group of sentences developing one main idea, or topic.
- Just like the meat, or main body of a hamburger, is held in place by the top and bottom bun, a paragraph is held together by the topic (top) and concluding (bottom) sentence. Good paragraphs are arranged and developed according to a definite plan.
- The topic sentence tells the reader what to expect and what you are going to talk about.
- All details, or development, are then focused on that topic. This makes the paragraph is easier to follow, and helps the reader better understand why the details are **relevant**.
- The concluding sentence adds closure, alerting the reader that the paragraph is done and reminding the reader of the paragraph's point.

Activity 1: Now we are going to play a game called hamburger smash. I am going to share some paragraphs and you have to decide if it has a good top and bottom bun holding it together. If the paragraph, or hamburger is not held together well, then we are going to smash the gummy hamburger.

Activity 2: Now, I am going to give you a bunch of strips of paper and I want you to see if you can arrange them into three solid "hamburgers" or paragraphs.

Activity 3: Now it's your turn to Write your own hamburger. Pick a topic that interests you and write something to share in the "Kid Magazine. (Show some examples of interesting paragraphs they could write for a magazine, either bring magazines, or books about countries, dinosaurs, etc. that have good summaries).

Possible Topics:

Great inventors	Favorite songs	Holidays
National Parks	Places to shop	Sports

Optional activity - practice outlining paragraphs. Note that when you outline a paragraph, the first and last Roman numeral should identify the topic sentence and the concluding sentence. The Roman numerals in between should each represent supporting details. <u>After you have outlined the paragraph, compare your outline to the same below.</u>

Writing a Paragraph

Topic Sentence

The topic sentence states the main idea and is usually the first sentence.

Development

The body of the paragraph contains details supporting the topic sentence. Three common ways of developing paragraphs include:

- 1) Giving examples
- 2) Telling incidents
- 3) Providing reasons

A good paragraph has **unity**. Unity means that every sentence in the paragraph develops the idea stated in the topic sentence. Any sentence that does not support the topic sentence should be removed from the paragraph.

Concluding Sentence

The concluding, or summarizing sentence, is used at the end of a paragraph. It restates the topic sentence in different words.

Example A Is this a good paragraph?

The Wild West was eventually tamed by law officers that risked their lives to bring peace and order.


Wyatt Earp is just one example of this. Earp is best remembered for the stand he and his brothers made against the Clanton gang at the O.K. Corral and for taming towns such as Tombstone, Arizona.

Another legendary lawman was Bat Masterson. Masterson served as sheriff of Ford County, Kansas, and assisted Wyatt Earp in ridding Tombstone and other towns of outlaws.

Perhaps the most celebrated peace officer of the time though was Wild Bill Hickok. Hickok was an amazing gunfighter and his bravery and determination put an end to lawlessness in many rough Kansas towns.

The peace officers who tamed the wildness of the Old West have become legends and should continue to be remembered for the contributions they made in bringing order to the land.

Jack and Jill used to love exploring hills, but soon learned the importance of caution.


One day, while exploring a hillside, Jack saw a tree growing over the edge of the hill and climbed on top of it.

The tree broke under Jack's weight and he fell down, breaking his crown.


Jill tried to catch Jack, but she ended up tumbling down the steep hill after him.

Jack and Jill still love to explore hills, but now they are more careful, especially when climbing trees.


